# Support group gives lift to polio sufferers

Polio Fellowship was re-established four years ago after disbanding in the 1960s. It currently has 120 members.

But according to Mr Joy, research has shown the county to have 500 Polio sufferers - many of whom are struggling to cope on their own.

"The branch can help with a lot of things," said Mr Joy, who is married with four children and works as a management trainer with the Inland Revenue. "We can help with transport, welfare or just provide someone to talk to."

The group is currently awaiting a response to its application for £3,500 from the National Lottery.

If the bid is approved, Mr Joy hopes to establish fellowship groups in every county town.

"People don't know we exist and some people don't even know the British fellowship exists," he said.

"A lot of people who joined us have said how happy they are to have lost that feeling of isolation."

The Lincolnshire branch of the British Polio Fellowship meets at 7pm on the second Monday of every month, at Ancaster Day Centre, in Boundary Street, St Catherine's, Lincoln.

The group is also holding a fundraising art exhibition at St Peter-at-Gowts Church Hall in High Street, Lincoln.

The exhibition, which is being sponsored by Lincoln Rotary Club, will take place over the weekend of October 16 and 17.
